"It's me, Doctor Maxine! I am going to check everyone's eyes, ears, nose and throat."







"My nose has been running all day," said Peter Pig.





I'll ask Doctor Maxine to check your nose and throat too," said Melrose Mare. "You may have a virus."








"I'm sorry friends. I can't leave home until I am healthy. We can play when I feel better," said Peter Pig.






Nurse Nancy was very busy making sure everyone saw the doctor or nurse.

Melrose Mare was busy too. She stomped on any bad bugs that she could see.






Nurse Ned checked everyone's eyes.






"I could see all the letters," said Rosie Rabbit. "I have good eyesight! And I'm hungry now."

"But wait. We must remember three things before we eat."




"Listen closely."


"One, wash your hands before you eat and after going to the toilet. Two, cover your coughs and sneezes and three, don't share anything that has been in your mouth."




"Has everyone washed their hands?" asked Rosie Rabbit.



"Great," said Melrose Mare. "We can have some fruit now. I see everyone has brought their own drink bottles – enjoy your snack!"








"Thank you for keeping us healthy and safe from bad bugs Melrose Mare," said Dexter. "We hope Peter Pig is better soon. We miss him."
